*Years 5 and 6 will be going down to the showground for a Remembrance Day ceremony on Monday 11th November. You are more than welcome to attend. The events for the day are:*

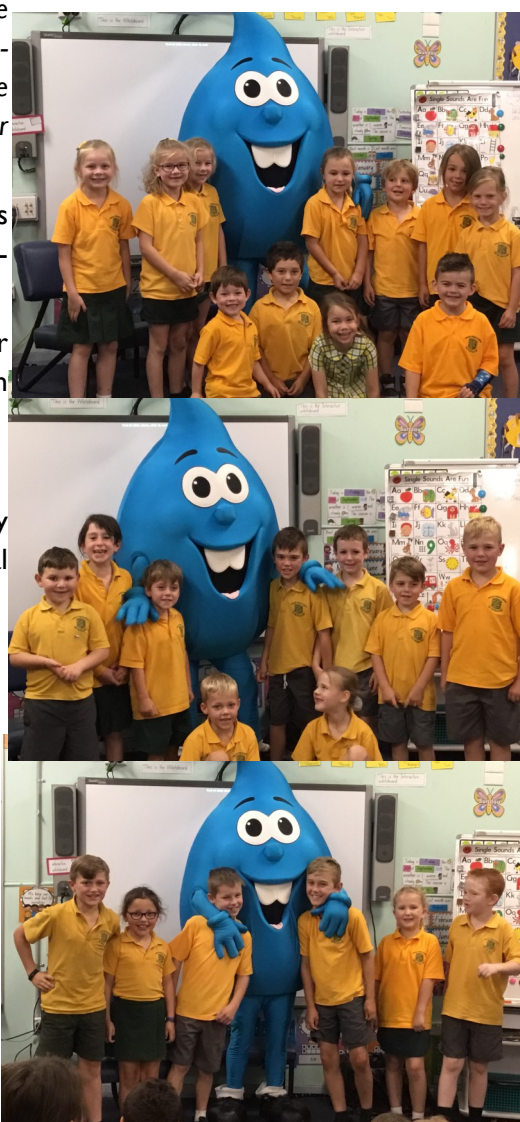
- 10.30am - Arrival of guests (children, staff, parents and community, Soc members)

Everyone loved Questacon with the breathtaking science display and all the different things to do.

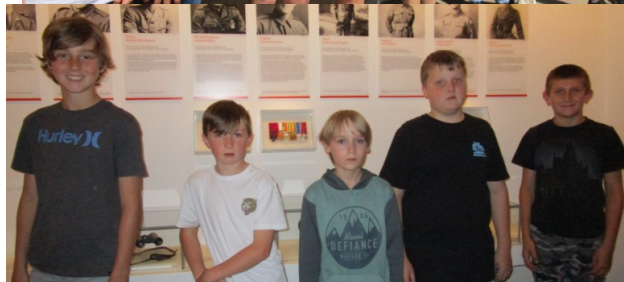

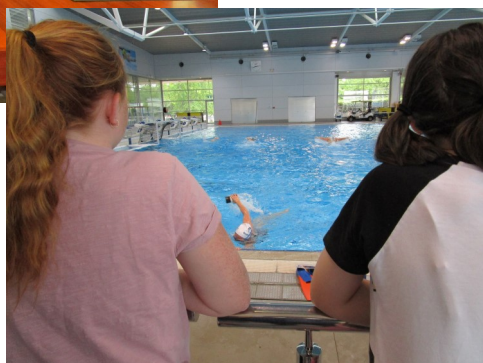

Basic concepts such as self -esteem, confidence (success), communication, discipline, appropriate behaviour, sportsmanship, nutrition, setting and achieving goals, personal behaviour, decision-making, appreciation and consideration are focused on in the program.

We look forward to welcoming all parents and students to Dungog High School.

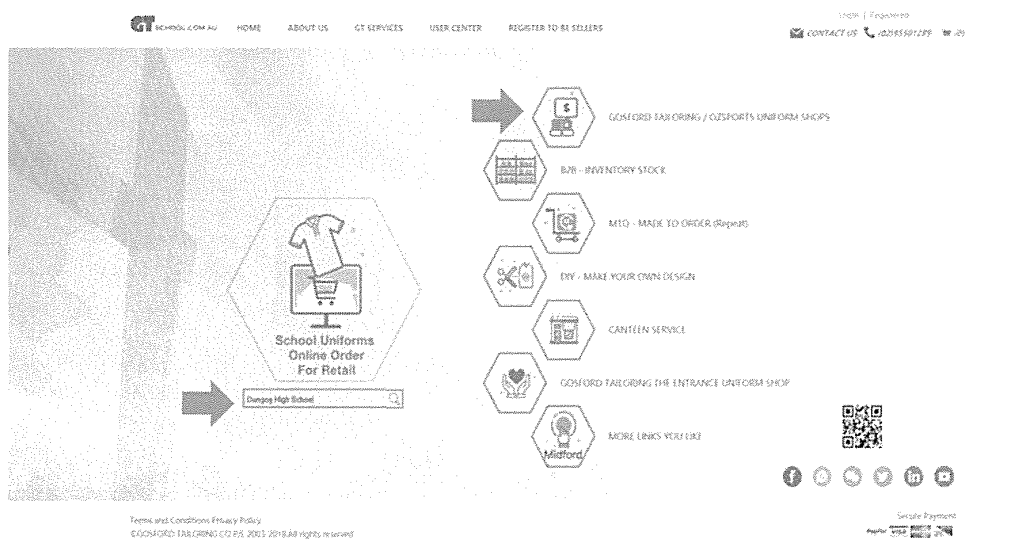
