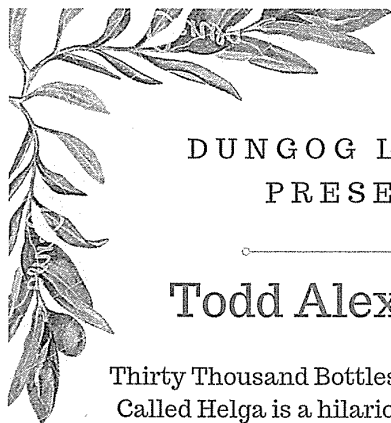

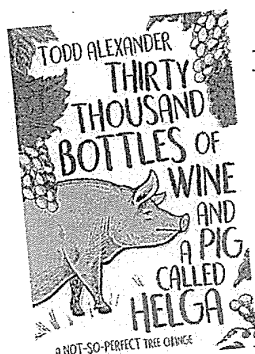
We have been helping the new kinders learn about school by showing them how to make beautiful rainbow fish and elephants!



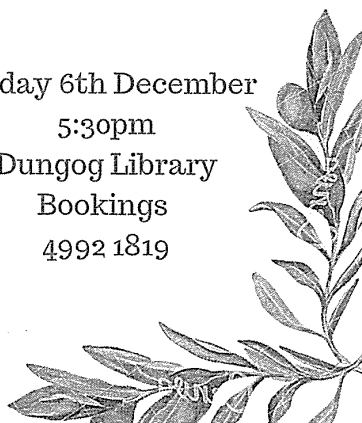

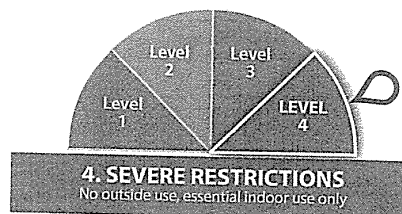

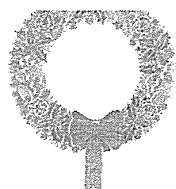

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INTENSIVE SWIMMING

TERM 4 WEEKS 8 and 9

Each Day 11.30pm-1.30pm

Dear Parents,

The Department of Education and Training School Swimming Scheme is an intensive learn to swim program which develops water confidence and provides students with basic water safety, survival and swimming skills.

Students who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water are eligible to participate in the School Swimming Scheme. The scheme focuses on non swimmers as well as students who are not confident swimmers.

Instruction will take place at Stroud Pool under the instruction of two Auswim qualified teachers. On Monday 2nd December all students K-4 will be assessed.

The scheme will continue daily for two weeks from Monday 2nd December to Friday 13th December. We will be walking to and from the pool under teacher supervision with two adults for each group to cross the road. There will be no cost for the scheme. All teachers attending have current emergency care and CPR qualifications.

Each child should bring a swimming costume, a towel, hat and sun protection to school each day. They will get changed at school before walking down to the pool. **A T Shirt or rash shirt is also required to wear in the water while swimming.** Thongs or sandals can be worn to and from the pool.

After the first assessment those students who are confident swimmers will not be participating in the scheme as it is only meant for non swimmers or students who are not confident swimmers.

We look forward to all the children progressing and developing their swimming skills in these two weeks.
