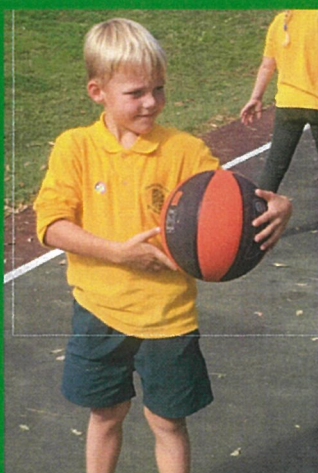

## Learning News

These are the topics the students have been learning in HISTORY.

*In kindergarten, year one and two the students have been learning about 'Past and Present Family Life.'* Students have the opportunity to learn about their own history and that of their family; this may include stories from a range of cultures and other parts of the world. As participants in their own history, students build on their knowledge and understanding of how the past is different from the present.

*In years three and four, students have been looking at 'Community and Remembrance.'* This topic provides a study of identity and diversity in both a local and a broader context. Moving from the heritage of their local area, students explore the historical features and diversity of their community. They examine local, state and national symbols and emblems of significance, and celebrations and commemorations, both locally and in other places around the world.

*In years five and six, students have been studying 'Australia as a Nation'.* This topic moves from colonial Australia to the development of Australia as a nation, particularly after 1901. Students explore the factors that led to Federation and experiences of democracy and citizenship over time. They understand the significance of Australia's British heritage, the Westminster system and other models that influenced the development of Australia's system of government. Students learn about the way of life of people who migrated to Australia and their contributions to Australia's economic and social development.

We really enjoyed developing our basketball skills as well. Keep working hard everyone!

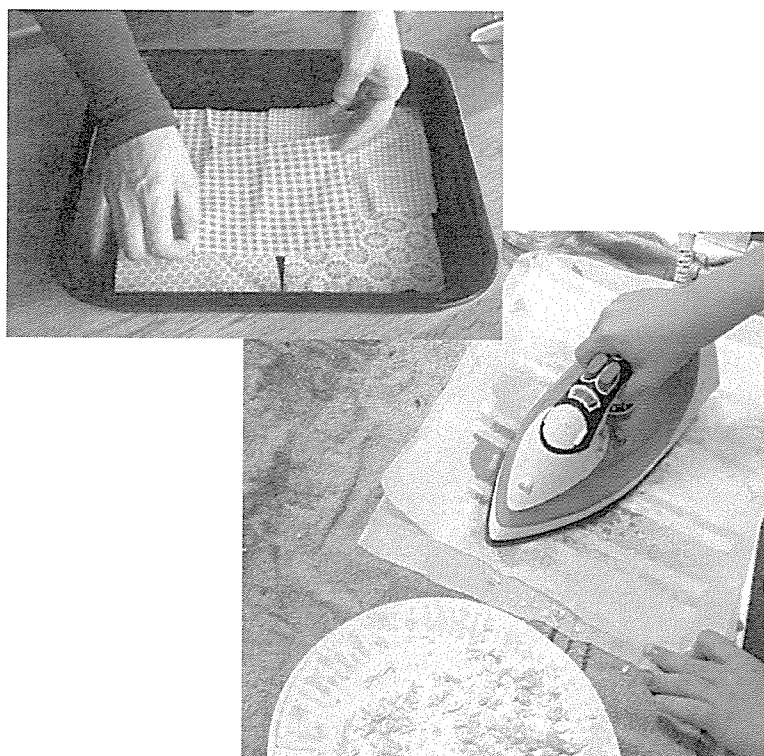
