*Stroud Brick and Rolling Pin Parade*

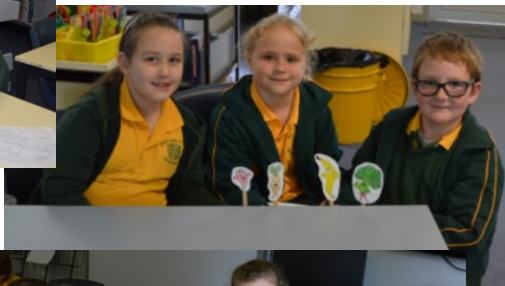

In maths, as we start the journey in fractions, we have been looking at halves and what are not halves.


In science, we have been making a sculpture out of plastic.



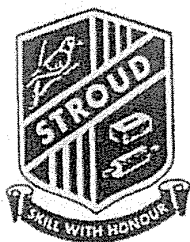
