

MODERATE RESTRICTIONS NOW IN FORCE*



Residential

Handheld hoses can be used for up to one hour every second day*, between the hours of 4pm and 9am. Garden irrigation systems can be used for 15 minutes as part of the one hour allocation.

Examples of outdoor use include:

- Car or boat washing: by bucket with trigger hose rinse only.
- Boat motor flushing: on a lawn area if possible.
- Topping up of pools.
- Cleaning driveways, paved areas, windows, walls and roofs: buckets only.

How every second day works: If your house is an even number then you can water on the even days of the month (the 2nd, 4th, 6th etc). If your house is an odd number, then you can water on the odd days of the month, (the 1st, 3rd, 5th etc). There is no residential outside water use on the 31st of the month.

Public Areas

Parks, gardens and non-active playing surfaces:

A 30% reduction on regular use is required, with users to develop a water management plan to achieve this target.

Active playing areas: A 30% reduction on regular use is required, with users to develop a water management plan to achieve this target.

Bowling greens and golf courses: Irrigation systems and hand held hoses for one hour per day on greens only (MidCoast Council will work with operators to develop management plans for use).

Garden ponds: Topping up by hand held hoses only.

Fountains: Total ban.

Commercial and Industrial

Nurseries and market gardens: Sprinklers and fixed hoses can be used before 9am and after 4pm. Hand held hoses can be used at any time.

Motor dealer vehicle washing: The use of machine washers with recirculation is allowed as is hand washing with a bucket and trigger hose rinse.

Mobile water tankers: Only to be used for firefighting, construction, inside residential, or public health purposes.

Construction industry: Hoses used must be fitted with a hand-held trigger to shut off flow when released.

There are no restrictions on water required for commercial/industrial production, however outdoor use is restricted as per the residential guidelines.

Level 1 moderate water restrictions are in force now

Moderate water restrictions are in force across the MidCoast region from Monday 2 September 2019 and tighter restrictions could follow in the coming weeks if the dry weather continues.

We're asking everyone across the MidCoast to ensure they are complying with these restrictions, which are mandatory.

The weather forecasts and our predictions of water usage indicate that we may need to increase restrictions, possibly as early as October.

Turn over for a guide to what's permitted during moderate restrictions. The restrictions apply to households, businesses and public areas – with Council restricting our watering of parks and public areas also – or using recycled or groundwater.

We have always appreciated the high level of cooperation from our community in times of restrictions, and we thank everyone for their efforts to save water now. We are facing a very dry spring and we will be relying on community support to conserve our water supplies and make it through this incredibly dry time.

What's the situation?

We initially thought restrictions would be necessary during this winter. However water usage continued to be low and with some rain at just the right time, we were able to avoid restrictions during the winter months.

In Stroud, we've already had to cease pumping to the River storage in July – so the situation is more serious here than for other towns across the MidCoast region. Currently storage is around 85%, so it's essential that Stroud customers abide by restrictions and conserve water wherever possible.


How do water restrictions work?

Understandably, people ask lots of questions about how and when water restrictions are introduced, and the system is complex. We have an established system and trigger levels for introducing water restrictions, which are part of a larger NSW standardised system. If you have questions, please visit www.midcoast.nsw.gov.au/waterrestrictions. There's a chance to ask any questions you have, if they're not answered there.


